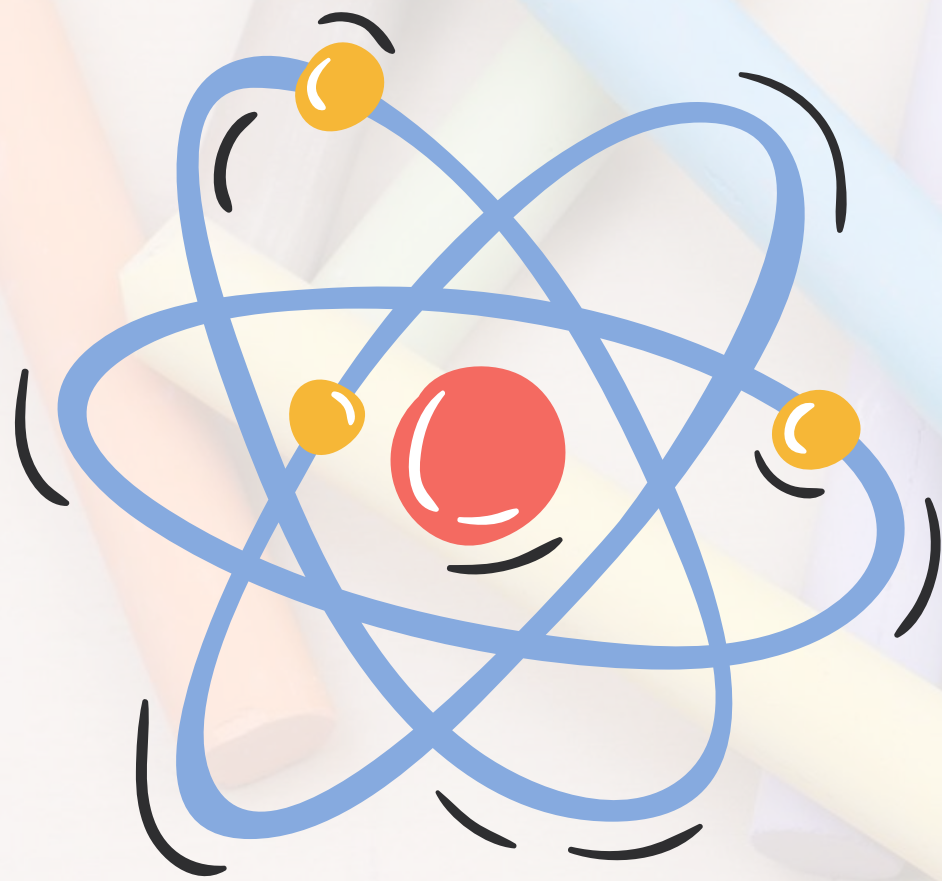

ABOUT THE PROJECT

This project addresses the urgent need to raise the quality of youth work in Europe, which has been weakened by the pandemic, economic pressures, and the war in Ukraine that displaced many qualified youth workers while pushing inexperienced newcomers into the field. This has created a gap between the quantity of youth initiatives and the quality of learning opportunities for young people. To respond, our initiative will train 30 youth workers from 9 European countries, combining non-formal education (NFE) and experiential learning to strengthen their competences. Participants will learn about, through, and for NFE by exploring methodologies, tools, and theories, and by applying them in practice through the design and testing of youth activities. The training will also emphasize teamwork, facilitation, intercultural dialogue, and civic engagement, while introducing models such as Kolb's learning cycle, Maslow's hierarchy, Bloom's taxonomy, and feedback frameworks. The expected outcomes are more competent and motivated youth workers, stronger partner organisations, and better learning opportunities for young people, especially those with fewer opportunities. In the long term, the project will result in a transnational network of skilled youth workers, a shared resource booklet on non-formal education, and follow-up initiatives that support sustainable, inclusive, and innovative youth work across Europe. By doing so, it contributes directly to the Erasmus+ objectives of promoting lifelong learning, intercultural understanding, active citizenship, and the recognition of non-formal and informal learning.

OBJECTIVES

1. Build a shared understanding and promote the value of non-formal education in youth work.
2. Strengthen youth workers' competences in facilitation, learning processes, and intercultural engagement.
3. Provide practical tools and techniques for designing and delivering quality youth activities.
4. Use Erasmus+ resources and best practices to enhance daily youth work.
5. Apply and test new competences through intercultural practice, collaboration, and peer exchange.

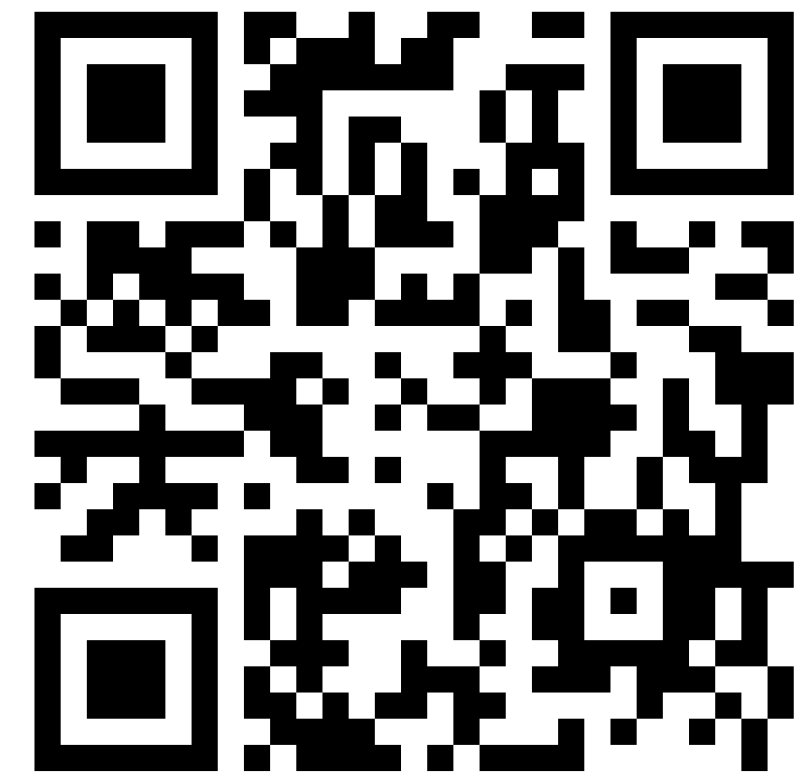


You can participate if you are:

- Between 24 and 35 years old;
- Able to communicate in English (minimum B1 level);
- Be a citizen or a resident of one of the included countries of the participating organisations;
- Able to fully and actively participate in the whole duration of the activity and in all sessions;
- Motivated to take part in a mutual learning process in a highly intercultural setting;
- Be curious, appreciate diversity, and learn about each other's realities;
- Ready to support dissemination and visibility activities online and offline.
- **Able to implement the follow-up initiative within 5 weeks after participation.**

PRACTICALITIES

ONCE SELECTED

Before the training course:

- Check the conditions for travelling to Vienna, Austria and back to your country.
- Purchase and collect all travel tickets after consultation and agreement with the coordinating organization.
- Cooperate with the participants from your country and prepare together for the trip and the mobility.
- Do the preparatory and "homework" tasks in your national group.

During the training course:

- Actively participate in all workshop sessions and the planned activities.
- Take part in the dissemination of the results of the mobility (posts on Social Media, videos, blog posts, etc).
- Deliver all travel documents to the hosting (EMOTiC) & coordinating organisation (UiB).

After the training course:

- Disseminate results, both offline and online (send all the documentation/pictures to the organizers).
- **Implement the local follow-up initiative that you designed with the national team during the training.**

JOURNEY

Procedures:

1. Fill in the application form to apply
2. Wait for the selection results

Once selected

3. send us a travel route suggestion including costs,
4. wait for approval/modification of the travel plan,
5. purchase the travel tickets by yourself,
6. travel and participate in the training course,
7. send us all travel documents once back home,
8. implement the local follow-up initiative,
9. receive the refund of your travel tickets.

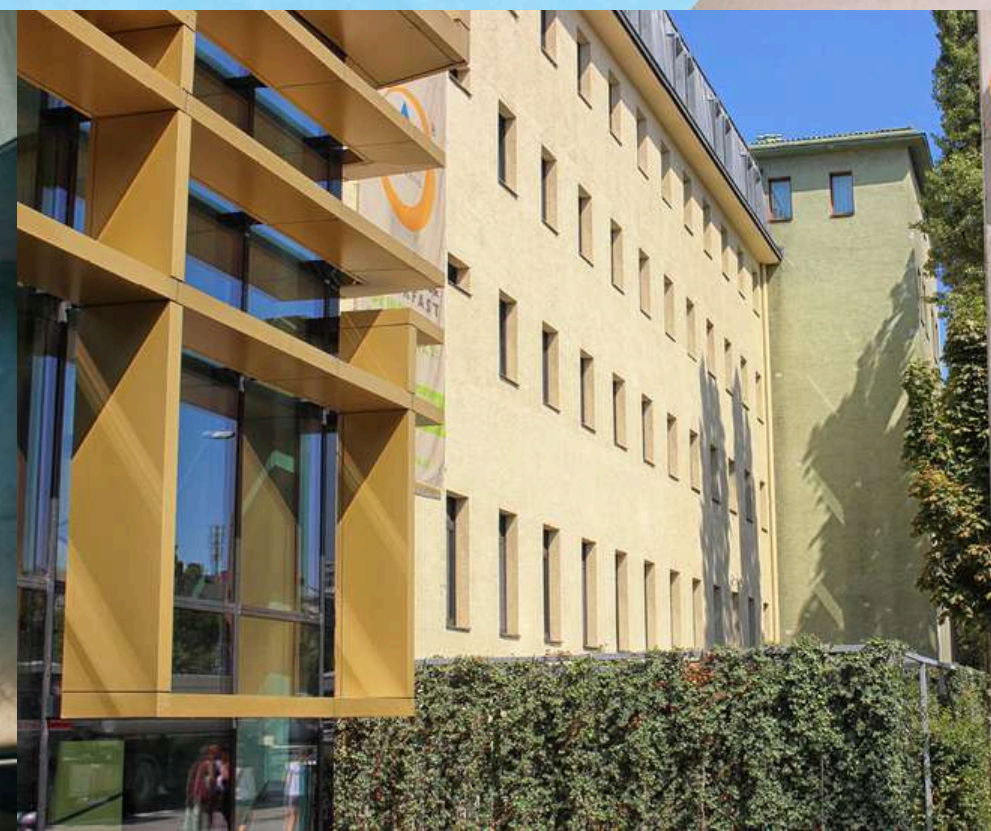
Participants are expected to arrive in Vienna no later than October 10th 2025 and depart no earlier than October 17th 2025.



VENUE

The mobility will be held at the Jugendgästehaus Wien Brigittenau in Vienna, Austria. Participants are required to arrive from the airport to the venue by themselves and also depart by themselves to the airport. You will be accommodated in rooms with 2 – 4 beds, which you will be sharing with participants of the same gender, however, mixed with participants from other nationalities who are also participating in the training course. All meals will also be provided by us at the same venue.

COSTS & TRAVEL INFORMATION

- The coordinator (UiB Germany) and the host (EMOTIC Austria) do not charge any participation fee. And both organisations are not responsible for any fees charged by your sending organisation.
- Accommodation, meals, and materials during the program are covered by the host directly.
- Participants are responsible for booking their own travel tickets to and from Vienna (either individually or with the support of their sending organization).
- Travel costs will be reimbursed by the coordinating organization after full participation in the mobility and upon submission of all original travel documents (tickets, invoices, boarding passes, receipts, and implementation of agreed on tasks, and submission of the EU Participant Survey, and doing the dissemination post on social media of the sending organisation on time).

! Important Notes:

- Only international travel costs are eligible for reimbursement.
- Local transportation in Vienna (e.g., from Vienna airport/ Vienna International bus Station /any Vienna train station to the venue and back) or during the week in Vienna are not reimbursed.
- The accommodation and training room are at the same place.
- Also, local transport to/from your house to your departure point (bus/train/airport) in your country is not reimbursed.
- Participants from Germany, Romania, and Greece: Only flight tickets will be reimbursed.
- If traveling by bus or train, and you are unsure whether your route is eligible, please contact us in advance.
- For air travel: we recommend taking only the small personal bag and the cabin bag of 10kg, without a check-in luggage.
